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STORY OF THE QUARTER

K. Malani is a 52-year-old mother living in a rural village in Kanthale, where daily life is a struggle. Her husband is a farmer. They have six children, the youngest is just 10 years old, while the others are grown, married, and living independently. Unfortunately, the children are unable to support their parents, due to their own unstable incomes. Malani and her husband face the hardships of life alone, burdened by sadness and challenges and find it difficult to experience the beauty and kindness the world can offer.

One fateful day, Malani's already challenging life took a tragic turn. Her village, often troubled by wild elephant activity, became the backdrop for a harrowing incident. While walking to her sister's home with her youngest daughter, Malani came face-to-face with a wild elephant. In their desperate attempt to flee, she stumbled over a stone and fell.

Recalling the moment, with tears in her eyes, Malani shared, "I closed my eyes in terror, and then I heard it—the sound of my bones breaking and the crushing pain as the elephant trampled my leg. The horrific noise of my flesh tearing and bones snapping still haunts me. Eventually, I lost consciousness."

When Malani regained consciousness, she found herself in a hospital bed. Her leg had been amputated from above the knee. That moment marked the beginning of an even darker chapter in her life, filled with hopelessness and despair.

Just when she thought there was no way forward, she learned of the existence of the Centre for Handicapped and it brought a glimmer of hope to her dark days. She decided to approach the Centre and, from that moment, her life began to change. The Centre arranged for her to receive a prosthetic limb through the generosity of Inner Wheel Club of Kandy which had set up an annual grant in memory of one of their members who had passed away a few months earlier.

Malani, filled with emotion, expresses her deepest gratitude:

"To the generous donors who gave me this gift of walking again, I have no words to describe my gratitude. You have not just given me a prosthetic leg—you have given me hope, strength, and a second chance at life. Thanks to you, I can now care for my youngest child, and I feel like I can stand strong for my family again. My heart overflows with thanks to the kind people at the Centre for Handicapped, who gave me compassion and the belief that life can be beautiful once more. You have shown me the kindness I never knew existed in the world."

With the help of the kind donor and the Centre, Malani is now determined to rebuild her life and hold her family together, proving that, even in the face of tragedy, hope and kindness can light the way forward.

Endowment Highlights of the Quarter

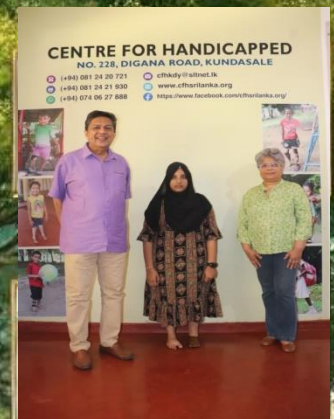
In 2007, the Centre for Handicapped established a pivotal Endowment Fund to address the persistent need for artificial limbs among those in need. Each endowment, consisting of substantial lump sum donations, is prudently invested, with the resulting interest used to provide limbs to many individuals each year. In 2024, we expanded our initiatives by launching a new endowment fund specifically for Orthosis devices. These contributions are invested strategically, and utilized to supply Orthosis devices to those who require them. Our donors receive a detailed update on the beneficiaries, including personal stories and photographs documenting the transformation from before to after the fitting of their new limbs or orthoses. The endowments are categorized as either Permanent Funds or Memorial Funds, often named in honour of cherished family members.

This quarter, we successfully provided artificial limbs to forty-one individuals through these endowments and we were delighted to welcome several of our generous donors to the Centre, where they had the privilege of meeting the recipients and personally presenting them with their new limbs. We extend our sincere thanks to all our donors for their steadfast support and generosity. Your contributions through these endowments have a significant and positive impact on the lives of those we assist, fostering a spirit of empathy and community.

PROJECT UPDATES OF THE QUARTER

1. Empowerment of Women Farmers with Disability and Widow Farmers in Northern Province

Supported by: Neelan Tiruchelvan Trust

The first phase of the NTT Project commenced on April 8, 2024, with an initial funding of Rs. 2 million. Measurements were successfully completed, and a comprehensive training program was launched to benefit the participants.

A key milestone was the Training Programme on Organic and Native Farming, conducted on June 28–30 and July 23–25, 2024, at the Seehela Ecological Farm in Elahare. These sessions equipped participants with essential skills in sustainable farming practices.

On October 2, 2024, equipment was distributed to 40 disabled and widowed women during a special limb-handing-over event held on August 9, 2024, in Mullaitivu and Kilinochchi. This initiative empowered the beneficiaries with the tools needed to effectively apply their newly acquired knowledge.

The project will conclude on March 31, 2025, with a total funding of Rs. 6,870,480.

This initiative has significantly transformed livelihoods, promoted sustainable farming practices, and paved the way for self-sufficiency and community development.



2. Empowerment of Disabled Farmers and Fishers in the Northern and Eastern Provinces of Sri Lanka

Supported by: Australian High Commission in Sri Lanka (Direct Aid Program Grant)

With a generous funding of AUD 80,000, the Empowerment of Disabled Farmers and Fishers in the Northern and Eastern Provinces of Sri Lanka is making a significant impact on communities in these regions.

The beneficiary selection process commenced on July 8, 2024, in Batticaloa and concluded on August 21, 2024, in Kilinochchi and Trincomalee. A site visit to the centre in Batticaloa was conducted on September 27, 2024, followed by another visit in Kilinochchi on October 22, 2024, to oversee the fitment process. The fitments were successfully completed in Mullaitivu on October 26, 2024.

Handing-over events were held on November 22, 2024, in Trincomalee, and December 18, 2024, in Mullaitivu, marking significant milestones in the project.

The initiative will conclude on June 30, 2026, delivering vital support and resources to the beneficiaries. This project highlights our unwavering commitment to uplifting vulnerable communities and improving their quality of life.



3. CAL Project

Helping Children Walk with Orthotic Devices

Supported by: Capital Alliance Ltd. (CAL) Foundation

With a total grant of Rs. 2,520,000 received last week, the CAL Project is set to transform the lives of 75 children in need of orthotic devices.

This six-month initiative focuses on providing essential mobility aids, enabling children to overcome physical challenges and significantly improving their ability to walk. The project reflects the CAL Foundation's unwavering commitment to creating lasting change and empowering young lives through mobility support.

In January 2025, 25 children from the Central Province visited the centre to receive their orthotic devices. Additionally, an outreach camp will be held in Ampara to support 25 children, followed by another outreach camp in Trincomalee, where 25 more children will benefit from the program.

This initiative marks another step forward in the CAL Foundation's mission to enhance mobility and improve the quality of life for children in need.



WIDER HORIZONS

Classes for Jolly Youngsters

Several years ago, the Centre for the Handicapped (CFH) founded the **Jolly Youngsters Club**, a special initiative dedicated to children who hold a unique place in our hearts. This club provides a safe and supportive environment where they can explore their artistic talents, develop social skills, and simply have fun in a nurturing setting. The activities also offer parents an opportunity to engage, connect, and share mutual support, creating a holistic community experience.

Every Thursday, the Centre comes alive with the vibrant sounds of laughter and joy as the Jolly Youngsters participate in club activities. From dancing and singing to crafting beautiful handicrafts, these sessions are filled with creativity and happiness. The children eagerly look forward to showcasing their skills to visitors, adding a sense of accomplishment and pride to their weekly routine.

At CFH, we are filled with immense pride and joy as we witness the transformation these activities bring to the lives of the Jolly Youngsters. The club fosters personal growth, creativity, and a profound sense of belonging, making it a cherished cornerstone of our community efforts.



LOOKING TO THE FUTURE – SCHOLARSHIPS FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

While Sri Lanka’s free education system ensures access to schooling from grade school to university, the associated costs—such as stationery, equipment, school bags, shoes, and transport—can create significant financial strain for economically disadvantaged families. Even a modest scholarship can make a world of difference, easing this burden and ensuring that children from underprivileged backgrounds can fully benefit from a quality education, paving the way for future success. Scholarships not only support academic development but also contribute to long-term opportunities, enhancing socio-economic mobility.

Working with the Rotary Club of Kandy

Since 2015, the Centre for Handicapped has proudly partnered with the Rotary Club of Kandy to provide educational scholarships for children with disabilities. These scholarships cover essential expenses not funded by the State, helping these children continue their education despite financial barriers. Initially, eleven children received support, and as they graduated or moved on, new recipients were chosen from CFH’s young beneficiaries. To date, fifteen children have benefited from this program, helping them build brighter futures despite the challenges they face.



A Partnership with the Zonta Club of Kandy

In the past three years, CFH has sponsored children through a Scholarship Program in collaboration with the Zonta Club of Kandy. Initially, the program supported thirty-two underprivileged school children, and thanks to the generous contributions of our donors, it has now expanded to assist even more students in need. Special thanks go to Zontians Jeeva Rajan, Deanne Dallas, RoseMarie Greve and Alison Gray, as well as other donors including Gehan Bandaranayake, and other kind-hearted supporters whose unwavering commitment has made this program's success possible. The Centre, the schools, and the children are deeply grateful for this continued assistance.



A Partnership with the Rotary Club of Salamanca

The Centre for Handicapped is thrilled to announce two new Scholarship Programs, generously supported by the Rotary Club of Salamanca and administered by CFH, Kundasale. The first program, running from April 2024 to April 2025, will assist twelve students with their educational needs. The second program, which began in January 2024, benefits eight students from various regions across the country, providing additional support for their studies. Each selected student will receive Rs. 2,000 per month to help cover school-related expenses. These scholarships are life-changing opportunities, enabling students to pursue their education and work toward brighter futures.

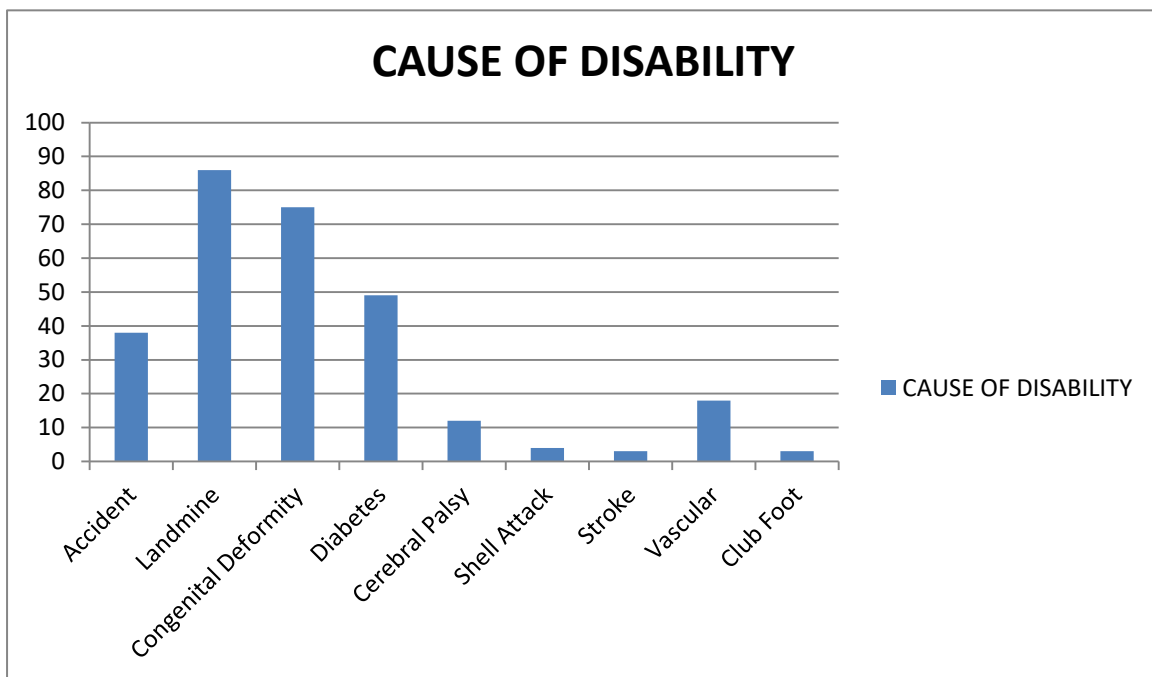
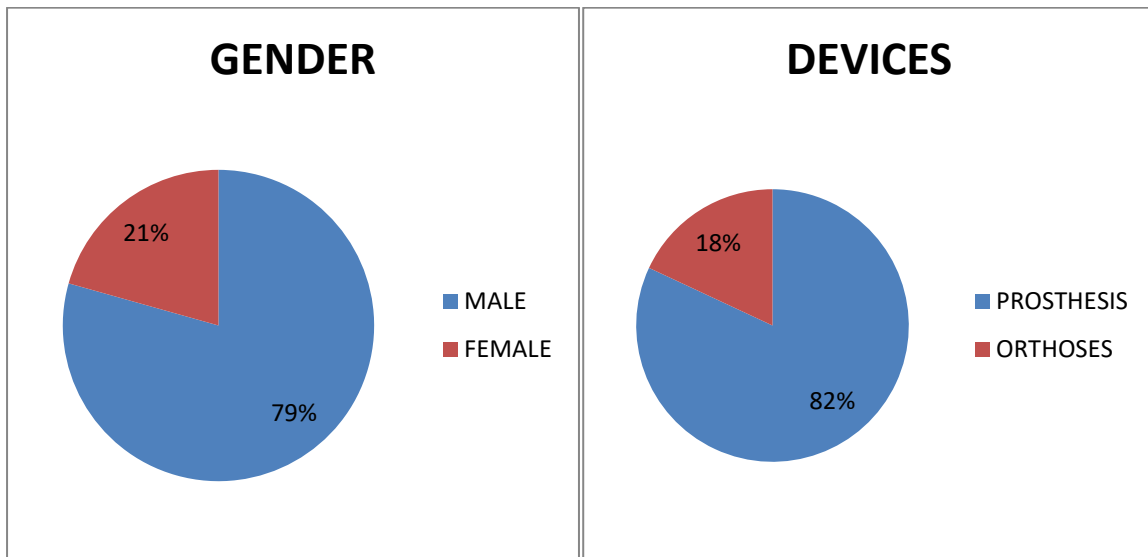

OUR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES



Prosthetics

The Centre initially fabricated aluminum limbs but subsequently switched into HDPE (High-Density Poly Ethylene) mobile limbs by using a more modern technology. This apart, the Centre has now introduced ICRC Polypropylene technology, which is a modular endoskeleton design and more comfortable for the limb users.

Orthotics

Since January 2006, the CFH has been fabricating lightweight custom-made polypropylene orthoses for people with physical disabilities brought on by congenital deformity, Polio, Muscle Paralysis and Arthritis.



Physiotherapy Services

The Centre for Handicapped offers physiotherapy services before and after the fitting of prostheses. It employs trained Rehabilitation Therapy assistants working under the guidance of a qualified physiotherapist. The department is well equipped with manual exercise facilities. It is now also open to a wider clientele.

Audiometry Screening Unit

The Audiometric Screening Unit offers free screening and testing for ears. The tests are conducted to identify any hearing loss and determine if hearing aids are necessary. If needed, hearing aids will be provided to our beneficiaries, depending on the availability of donated hearing aids from abroad.



Ophthalmology

The newly equipped ophthalmology unit provides a complete screening & testing of the eye for cataracts also eye related diseases. Spectacles are provided if required by the beneficiary.

The Centre for Handicapped is a nonprofit, charitable organization registered and approved by the Government of Sri Lanka under Registration No. MSS/7/8/NSPD/R/123 – Section 20 – of the “Protection of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities” – Act No. 28 of 1996. Centre for Handicapped is an approved charity by Gazette Notification No. 2144/23 of 09.10.2019.

The Centre has been working towards the rehabilitation of people with disabilities since 1971, under different names such as the Kandy Orthopedic Centre and the “Colombo Friend In Need Society, Kandy Branch.” It acquired its present identity as the “Centre for Handicapped” in 2001. The centre receives technical and financial support from national and international governmental and non-governmental bodies. It also receives funds through corporate and individual donations.

Our Vision

To be a Centre of excellence in the provision of artificial limbs and rehabilitation service to persons who need them.

Our Mission

To enable persons who are physically handicapped, irrespective of race religion, ethnicity, caste or status to lead near normal lives.
